After travelling the State of NSW annually, to attend and experience the premier family history event on the calendar, which is the Conference of the NSW&ACT Association of Family History Societies, the 2012 Conference was held in the heart of the Shire. The planning took over two years and was a continuous learning experience, particularly from the recent conferences held in Inverell, Shoalhaven and Wyong. It is with much appreciation that the efforts of the Family History Societies in those locations shared their knowledge, developed initiatives and experiences that has been a valuable contribution to the planning of our opportunity to host the conference.

It was a privilege being the BBFHS delegate for the NSW&ACT Association of Family History Societies. It was a privilege and proud moment to be there amongst nearly 400 avid family historians, to see our Conference 2012 Team on stage and to have all the BBFHS members attending the Conference, stand in appreciation. It was a privilege to then hear and feel the gasp of all the others attending, to see the level of active involvement and passion of BBFHS. For the Shire, for BBFHS members and for expanding the horizons of family history in NSW, this was a wonderful event and a memorable experience.

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The Conference was held at the Tradies, in their newly refurbished facility at Gymea. The support of this Club has strengthened a building relationship of future involvement. Tradies' staff and management played a vital role in the smooth running of the event.

Introduced by the Shoalhaven FHS and built on by the Inverell FHS, the Free Family History Expo on the Friday before the Conference started, included several presentations and an extensive display of Society information. Trade tables and many other family history focused organisations were also on display. Over 200 members of the public visited on the Friday.

The presentations by Heather Garnsey, Lorraine Turtle, Marilyn Rowan, Jill Ball, Emma Kelly, Joy Murrin and Jan Gow covered a wide range of topics, in particular the availability of research information from The National Archives, NSW Births Deaths and Marriages and family history websites.

On Friday afternoon the NSW&ACT Association of Family History Societies held a Forum for interested societies. The particular topic of discussion was associated with the changing distribution of the societies' journals. Many groups and associations are transitioning to e-Journals, having them available for downloading from the website. Central Coast FHS provided information on their experience, the reasons for the change, the benefits and how the society addressed issues from members. This Forum proved to be a constructive and effective way of communication and discussion. It is hoped that such a forum becomes a regular occurrence at the Conferences and that the state representatives of the association actively promote a forum within their areas.

Friday witnessed a lot of networking; catching up with and developing new friends. A busy and successful day closed with the Meet and Greet for delegates who were welcomed by the conference team wearing costumes reflecting colonial society.

Following the enjoyable social event on the Friday night, delegates arrived in good time for the opening of the Conference doors, to take their seats for the beginning of a memorable day. The Welcome to Country was provided by Les Bursill OAM and the official opening by Sutherland Shire Mayor Carol Provan. The welcomes were followed by the Vincent John Crowe Memorial Address presented by Carol Liston on Discover On-Line Land Records. The gathering was advised by Carol of the exciting news that the NSW Torrens Title Purchase Records Index 1863-1971 is likely to be on-line by the end of 2012.

In the session before lunch, talks were presented by Ian Heads OAM - *Things Found Along the Way: Discoveries and Dilemmas of a Sporting Historian*, and Trish Levido - *Valuing Memories: Your Spoken Family History Legacy*. Ian shared with the audience some of the real dialogue behind the great pictures we have seen in the media over time. Also shared were a number of opportunities he had to interview the greats of sports and to capture those special moments. Trish followed Ian on a similar theme, the importance of the oral history and interviews. Trish highlighted that we all have a unique story of life and we are the best ones to tell it.

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In the sessions after lunch, delegates had to choose, as there were two concurrent presentations. Many delegates were observed to be hurrying to get to the presentations of their preference. The first session gave the choice of Carole Riley - *Why Family Historians Should Embrace Social Media* and BBFHS member Pat Fearnley - *An Adventure: Build Your Own Website*. Pat shared with delegates her skills and insight that have been instrumental in the BBFHS success in being awarded the Dorothy Fellowes Website Award twice for the best Society Website. Having to choose proved to be a challenge and both presentations were very well attended. The second round of choices involved Caitlin Hickie - *Preserving Your Family History Amidst the Challenges of Technology* and Kerry Farmer - *DNA Technology and Family History*. Again interest and attendance was very high in both talks. The Technology spoken about by Kerry involved DNA and concluded that likely family connections, over the generations, will become of increased interest in the future.

A number of presentations took place during the evening. Firstly the NSW&ACT Association Awards. The Dorothy Fellowes Website Award was given to the Central Coast FHS and the Cynthia Foley Encouragement Award went to the Parramatta Female Factory Friends. It was great to have both Dorothy and Cynthia at the dinner to present these Awards.

AFFHO Awards were presented by President Kerrie Gray, with the Nick Vine Hall Award for the Category A Society going to the Cape Banks FHS for their Journal *Kith & Kin* and Category B to The Heraldry & Genealogy Society of Canberra for their Journal, *The Ancestral Searcher*.

Without hesitation delegates were back on Sunday morning to experience further tales of research and to hear more on technology and how it can be harnessed by the genealogical community. Brad Manera, in his talk - *Private William Irwin's Adventure: discovery of an Anzac Story*, presented this story with a passion to find the story behind the stories. You could feel the emotion in his findings. Lisa Murray followed with the presentation - *Community Connections: Technology and the Renaissance of Local and Family History*.

After morning tea, Paul Parton from FamilySearch introduced their concept plans to develop a single Family Tree for the Human Race. This was followed by BBFHS member, Paul Brunton's presentation - *The Great What-if of Australian History: the Endeavour Voyage*

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and the Charting of the East Coast of Australia. Both talks were very interesting and informative. These talks were the last of the speakers.

PROGRAM

Attendance at Conference 2012 was very valuable to Conference 2013 organisers and helped us determine the program for 2013. One of the key lessons is the importance of a family history fair on the Friday. This was emphasised by a couple of key exhibitors who said, quite simply, that it would not be viable for them to attend otherwise.

While all elements are not yet finalised, the draft program is as follows:

- **Friday** – a family history fair open to the public with two formal presentations, a number of short talks, a workshop or two and plenty of trade tables and a 'meet and greet' at the end of the day.
- **Saturday** – Vincent Crowe memorial address to be delivered by Canberra historian David Headon, presentations throughout the day and the Conference Dinner in the evening.
- **Sunday** – presentations and panel sessions with the conference finishing at lunchtime.
- We are now in the process of approaching speakers with a view to having them all confirmed so that a program is available before early bird registrations open on 1st March 2013.

Discussions have begun with NLA and AWM about their role at Conference and other institutions will be approached shortly.



